STUDY PROGRAM



LEARNING OUTCOMES

The education process at universities in Poland is based on the Polish Qualifications Framework, i.e. a set of qualifications which a higher education graduate should obtain as specified by law. The qualifications are divided into 3 categories: knowledge (the student knows and understands), skills (the student can) and social competences (the student is ready to). At the level of each university, this description of qualifications is detailed for individual fields of study in the form of field-specific learning outcomes.

ECTS CREDITS

ECTS credits reflect the hourly workload of a student which they must devote to completing a course and achieving the assumed learning outcomes. One ECTS credit corresponds to 25-30 hours of student work in direct contact with an academic teacher or independent work of the student, e.g. at home.

PLAN OF STUDIES

Each field of study has a plan of studies, which is a list of all classes that are carried out within the field of study in individual years and semesters. The plan of studies includes the number of hours of classes, forms of classes within individual courses (e.g. lectures, workshops or laboratories) and ECTS credits assigned to a course.

COURSE OUTLINE

The course outline is a detailed program of teaching a given course. Each course must follow the content of the outline. The teacher conducting the classes is responsible for familiarising students with the course outline and the conditions for crediting the classes.



Lecture - a fundamental part of university education. In these sessions, students learn about the theoretical basis of issues discussed in classes. Systematic participation in these meetings is key to fully benefiting from them and successfully passing exams.

Seminar - during these classes, students actively work with the teacher and participate in discussions.

Workshops - during these classes, students actively interact with the teacher and groupmates, solve practical tasks and participate in discussions.

Laboratory - similar to workshops, but are held in smaller groups and in special laboratories, including computer

Foreign Language Workshops - as stated, workshops in a foreign language course.

Project - an opportunity for students to show their creativity and apply theoretical knowledge to practical use. Projects are often organised in teams, which develops students' communication skills and cooperation in a group. It also teaches students to manage time, resources and the distribution of tasks in a team.

Diploma Seminar - classes held in the later years of studies, where students prepare to write their diploma theses on their own and consult the progress with their diploma thesis supervisor.

Vocational Apprenticeship - a type of classes held outside the University, at a workplace related to the field of study.

Office hours - during the academic year, all teachers have office hours for students on selected days. If you need some help with difficult matters during the semester or before an exam/credit, you should definitely take advantage of these.



Studying for free?

A scholarship is a way to study for free. You can apply for several types of scholarships and financial aid. Receiving one type of scholarship does not exclude using others. There are quite a few to apply for.

Social scholarship

You can apply for it already for the first semester of studies. The condition is not to exceed the amount of PLN 1,908,9 net income per person in the

DEADLINES FOR SUBMITTING APPLICATIONS:

- by June 30 if you are applying for a scholarship for the Fall/Winter semester (for first-year students the deadline is October 15)
- by April 5 if you are applying for a scholarship for the Spring/Summer semester

Rector's scholarship

To apply for it, you must:

- pass a semester of studies
- obtain a grade point average of at least 4.0 for that semester (the higher the average, the better the chances)
- pass tests and exams in the first take (only one retake is allowed in the semester)
- · additional scientific, artistic or sports activity is recommended Note – a student in the first year of second-cycle studies can also apply for the scholarship.

APPLICATION DEADLINES:

- by September 30 if you are applying for a scholarship for the Fall/Winter
- by April 5 if you are applying for a scholarship for the Spring/Summer semester

Minister's scholarship for significant achievements

(for outstanding and ambitious students)

To apply for it, you must:

- pass the previous year of studies
- · demonstrate significant scientific or artistic achievements related to your studies, or significant sporting achievements

REMEMBER:

- the scholarship is awarded by the minister at the request of the Rector
- you must submit your application by September 30 to the Student Benefits Department

Social scholarship in an increased amount

For full-time students receiving a social scholarship, whose distance from their place of permanent residence to the University is at least 50 km (it does not matter whether you live in a student dormitory or rent a room). The application deadlines are the same as for the social scholarship.

Scholarship for the disabled

It can be received by a student due to a disability confirmed by a decision of the relevant body. The amount of the scholarship depends on the degree of disability. Application deadlines are the same as for the social scholarship.

Allowances

A benefit may be granted to a student who has temporarily found themselves in a difficult life situation. The benefit is granted upon a written application by the student, who is obliged to document the circumstances constituting the basis for the application. The application for assistance must be submitted within two months of the occurrence of the given circum-

At first, university is a new and unfamiliar place, so it may seem strange and difficult. You probably have many questions: Where to settle the necessary formalities? What is important? Who can help me? Here are some tips on how to effectively navigate the University.

DEAN'S OFFICE

The heart of the University. Here you will handle most student matters, get all the necessary information (concerning studies, exams, payments), receive your diploma at the end of your studies.

However, you can handle many matters without having to visit the Dean's Office - through the University's IT system. You will electronically submit an application (and receive a response) regarding individual organisation of studies, conditional take, academic leave, etc. You can also use the system to submit an application for the certificate you need (e.g. certificate confirming your student status).

EXAMS AND CREDITS

At UITM, particular courses start and end on various dates throughout the semester, and exams and tests for credit are conducted immediately after the end of classes in a given course (during the semester). This way of knowledge verification in smaller doses (instead of a two-week exam "marathon") gives students the opportunity to master the material from individual courses more systematically and thus more effectively.

Guide to exam and credit takes

Zero take - it gives students an additional opportunity to take an exam. This take is not mandatory, and failing it does not result in a negative grade. Zero takes are offered for courses considered the most difficult, but only students who regularly attend classes have the right to the zero take.

First take - the first, official take of an exam/test for credit. Remember that these takes are visible in the schedule of classes, and dates are set by the teachers conducting the given courses (test for credits are usually taken during the last class in the semester).

Retake - you are entitled to one retake of an exam/test for credit from each form of classes and from each course in a semester (retakes do not apply to vocational training and the second part of the diploma seminar). A retake is free of charge.

Conditional take - if you failed to pass the course in the first take and in the retake, you can apply for a conditional take, i.e. another attempt to pass the exam/obtain a credit. In a given semester, with the Dean's consent, you can have a conditional take in a maximum of 4 courses/forms of classes. Before the conditional take, you get mandatory, paid consultation, in order to help you understand the material and discuss any challenging issues with a teacher.

Repeating a course - if you fail to pass an exam/obtain a credit in the conditional take, you can apply to the Dean to repeat the course. The deadline for passing a repeated course is set by the Dean, but this deadline cannot be shorter than one semester or longer than two academic semesters.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT SUPPORT OFFICE (ISSO)

For years, our University has been educating foreigners in both Polish and English; currently, people from 50 countries study at UITM. That is why the University has the International Student Support Office, which coordinates adaptation and integration activities addressed to the entire academic community, but especially to international students. The Office is responsible for running the Adaptation Counselling Centre, coordinating the Buddy program, providing language support for foreign students writing their theses in Polish, as well as support in matters related to legalisation of stay, health insurance, or nostrification of diplomas.



Adaptation Counselling Centre

Students struggling with problems such as culture shock, homesickness, or issues in communicating with University employees can take advantage of a free consultation at the Adaptation Counselling Centre.

Student Self-Help Program

Within this program, senior students, together with an international student writing his/her thesis and with his/her supervisor, help with linguistic proofreading of a diploma thesis prepared in Polish.

Community-building events

The Office regularly organises events that are aimed at integrating the community and getting to know students from different cultures and countries of the world. These events are organised for holidays (Christmas, Easter), as well as Culture Meetings (Polish Day, Asia Day, etc.), at which students from particular countries present their cultures, customs, dances and history. Every year in June, the International Day is organised, which is an outdoor community-building event for students of all nationalities.

Buddy program

No one understands a student as well as another student, which is why one of the forms of support is the Buddy program, in which older students support younger colleagues in solving study-related problems and in practical issues related to their stay in Poland (e.g. setting up a bank account, using public transport, or providing assistance during visits to offices).

Orientation Week

At the beginning of the first semester, newly arrived international students take part in workshops organised by the Office within the Orientation Week program. During the workshops, in addition to basic information about Poland and Rzeszów, students get knowledge about academic etiquette, the organisational culture at UITM, as well as internal regulations applicable at the University.

STUDENT DICTIONARY

Individual organisation of studies (IOS) - it is a flexible learning option designed to accommodate your specific needs and circumstances. You can apply for IOS no later than 30 days from the start of the semester. If your application is approved, it may exempt you from mandatory attendance in some courses or some forms of classes during the semester. To be eligible for IOS, you must have a valid reason, such as full-time work or an internship/training. The individual organisation of studies is valid for one semester. Please remember that even if you are granted IOS, you still need to come to exams and tests according to schedule.

Absences - as a student, you are obliged to participate in classes organised by the University; in the case of lectures and tutorials, the decision on whether participation in classes is obligatory is made by the teacher conducting the classes. During the first class, the teacher presents the conditions for justifying and making up absences. You can justify your absence to the teacher e.g. by presenting a sick note (certificates such as excuses from parents are not accepted at the university).

Mind you, prolonged unjustified absence from classes may be grounds for expulsion!

KultURalia - an important point in the Rzeszów student calendar; it is a large event organised by the student councils of UITM and the University of Rzeszów. This is an event where there is no room for boredom, with numerous concerts and an unforgettable atmosphere. Timing: end of May – beginning of June.

Tutor for the field of study – an academic teacher appointed by the Dean, whose main task is to provide advice and assistance to students in a given field of study in all matters related to the organisation of studies. You will meet your tutor at an organisational meeting planned before classes begin. The list of tutors for the particular fields of study is available at the University website in the pages for the Dean's Offices.

Group representative – a person selected from among the students in the group to represent them in all matters.

Student ID No. - your university identification number.

Rector's hours – times/days free from classes for the entire University, established by the Rector at special times in the University's life.

Colloquium/test – an announced student test.

Entrance test – a type of short test, which may be unannounced.


STUDENT ETIQUETTE or how to avoid misunderstandings

In your daily interactions with university staff, including teachers, employees of the Dean's Office, and other departments, it's important to maintain a sense of etiquette and professionalism. While our University is modern and dynamic, following these etiquette rules can help make your student life smoother and minimise misunderstandings.

Let's see the rules of etiquette on specific examples:

If you need to inform your teacher that you are unwell and will be unable to attend a class, use your student email for this communication. This helps maintain a formal and organised channel of communication with your instructors.

REMEMBER that e-mail of every teacher or administrative employee consists of the following: first letter of their first name + last name (without Polish characters) + @ + wsiz.edu.pl = for example,




When seeking in-person consultations:

- Knock before entering: If you need to meet with your teacher in person, always knock on their office door before entering. This shows respect for their privacy and space.
- Greet everyone in a shared office: When entering an office where multiple people work, greet everyone present collectively-rather than individually. After entering, specify whom you have come to see.
- · Say goodbye when leaving.

Keep in mind the following:

- Dean's Office entrance: There's typically no need to knock when entering the Dean's Office because it has several stands for different fields of study.
- Office hours: Be sure to check the indicated opening hours for each department in advance to ensure you visit during the appropriate times.

By following these guidelines, you can maintain a respectful and professional demeanour in your interactions with teachers and university staff.



How you should behave during classes:

- Turn off or silence your mobile phone and any other mobile devices during classes.
- Do not eat or drink in the classrooms.
- Arrive on time for classes. Small delays are sometimes tolerated, but they shouldn't happen often. If you are late, enter discreetly, without causing a disturbance.
- If you have to leave early, inform the teacher before the class; if the teacher gives their consent, leave the room at the given time without unnecessary disturbance, e.g. without saying goodbye loudly.

How you should behave during exams and tests:

- Do not forget to take the necessary supplies; it is also a good idea to have a spare pen.
- The examiner has the right to check your identity when letting students into the room, so have your student ID or another identity document with you.
- During the exam/test, all phones, bags, backpacks and outerwear must be put in the place indicated by the teacher.
- Dress smart do not come to the exam/test in sportswear or other inappropriate clothing.

NOTE!

According to the UITM Study Regulations, each student is obliged to:

- take exams and obtain credits on time and without undue assistance,
- · prepare a diploma thesis on their own,
- comply with the University's rules for using generative AI technology and tools.

Failing to comply with those rules will result in the teacher taking decisive action and may be grounds for initiating disciplinary proceedings against the student.
